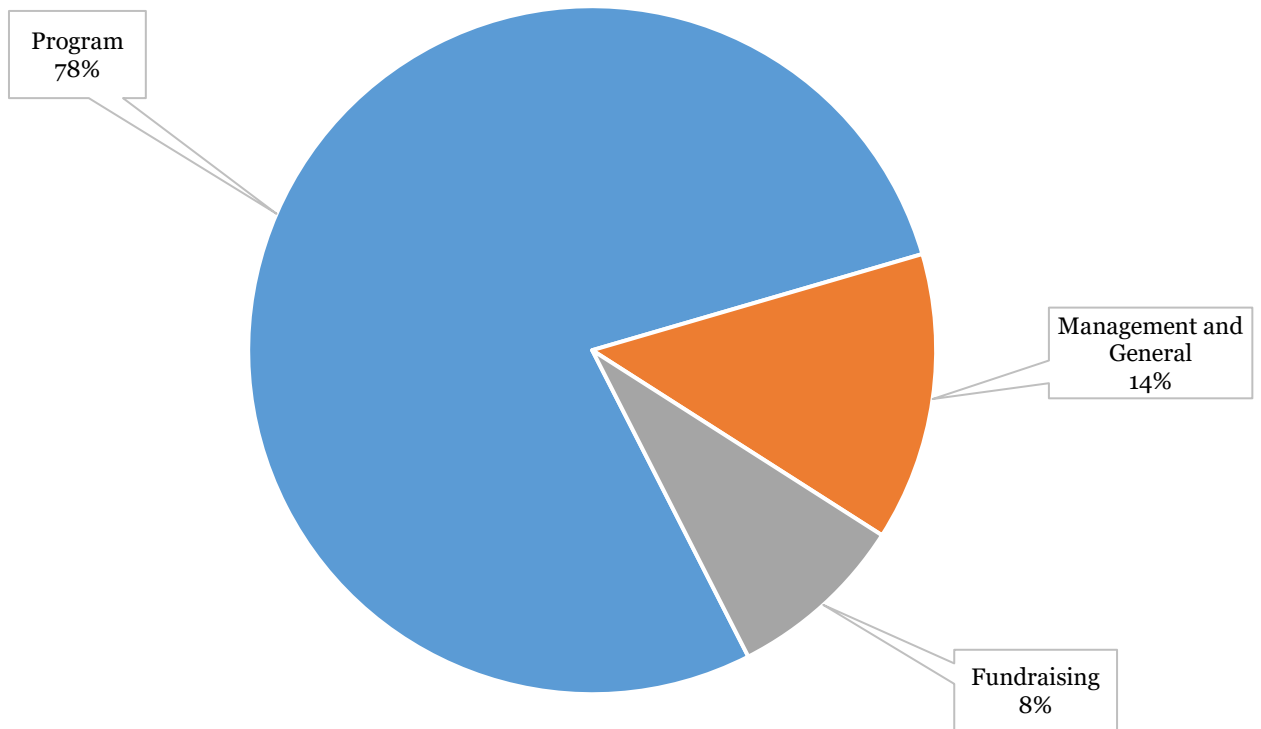

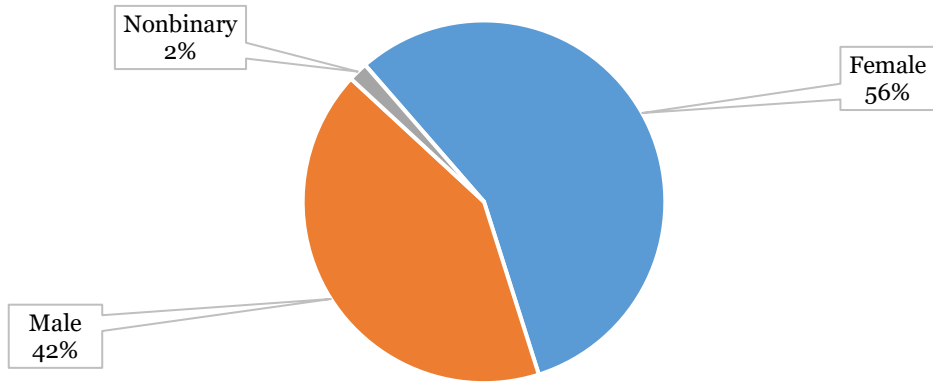

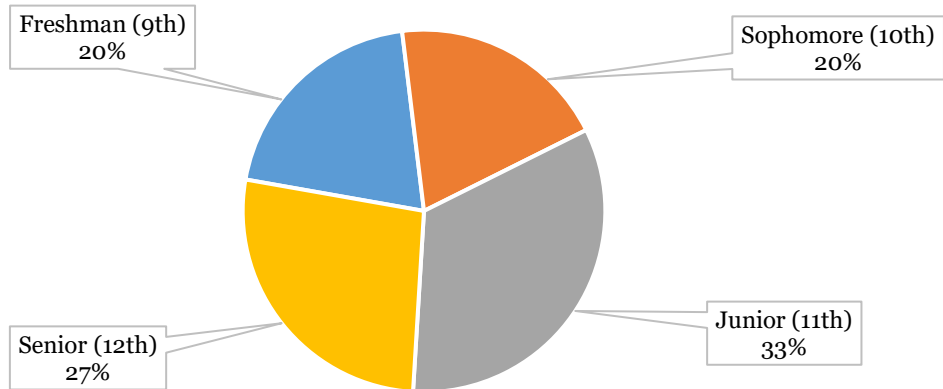
Expenses
